This is a youth work project offering off road motorcycling & maintenance in exchange for a contract We use a purpose built training track licensed from the MoD. Bikes include Yamaha TTR125s, Honda CR125, Kawasaki KX125s, KX85s and YZ85. Members organise trips & recruit volunteers. Maintenance of the bikes is undertaken by members, motivating numeracy & literacy. Member self government is key.
